Now Covers More New Mexicans!

Do You Qualify for FREE Health Care Coverage?

You may be able to get Medicaid if:

- You are a citizen or lawfully present immigrant, and
- Your household income (before taxes) is under:

If you cannot get Medicaid, **your children may still qualify.** You do not have to give social security numbers or immigration documents for you or family members who are not enrolling. **Pregnant women, seniors, and people with disabilities** may also qualify—check with Medicaid to see if you can get coverage.

What Health Care is Covered?

Medicaid pays for your care whenever you see a doctor or nurse, go to a clinic or hospital, or visit **any Indian health care provider.** Medicaid covers most services including:

Get Enrolled!

You can apply for Medicaid:

- * At an ISD office near you
- * Online from a computer
- * By phone, fax, or mail
- * In-person at community agencies, hospitals and clinics across the state

Simple and easy! Medicaid will look for your records from government agencies so you do not need to prove things like citizenship or immigration status unless your records cannot be found. You may have to prove income. If you or your family members cannot get proof of employment, you can sign a statement declaring your income.

Other low-cost coverage. If you don't qualify for Medicaid, you can apply for financial help to get coverage on the Exchange during the next open enrollment period from November 1, 2015-January 31, 2016. You may be able to apply at other times of the year if you have a life change, or if you are Native American.
